Easter Services An Issue For Kerry

(Undated) -- As Easter Sunday approaches, where the Democratic candidate for president Senator **John** Kerry will attend church has become an issue. According to Ecumenical News International, Archbishop Michel Sabbah says they can help end the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and his Lutheran counterpart has urged people not to despair. Archbishop Sabbah, the most senior Roman Catholic cleric in the region, made the plea while delivering his Easter message at a news conference in the Old City of Jerusalem. Sabbah is the leader of some 400 thousand Catholics in Israel, the West Bank, Gaza Strip and Jordan and in 1987, he became the region's first Palestinian patriarch.
